### What if I need to work on or cross the right-of-way?

Before starting any work on or driving over the pipeline, contact your local One-Call Center in advance. Most areas require at least 3 working days notice, but check your local regulations to learn other requirements in your area by visiting [ClickBeforeYouDig.com](http://ClickBeforeYouDig.com).

The One-Call Center will notify the facility owners in your area, who will send representatives to mark these facilities with flags, paint or other marks, helping you to avoid damaging them. Even if you have a locate, a South Bow representative must be present anytime you are excavating on a South Bow right-of-way (ROW).

### What kind of work needs approval?

Before starting any work on a pipeline ROW, you must obtain permission from the pipeline operator. This includes activities like digging on the ROW (even if it's by hand), building a temporary or permanent structure on the ROW or even storing a dirt pile on the ROW.

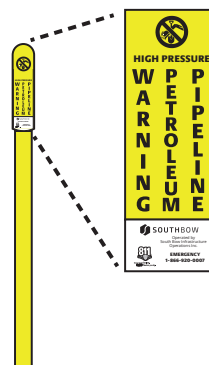
## RIGHT-OF-WAY SIGNS

Pipeline marker signs are placed along the ROW at road crossings, railway crossings and watercourse crossings. They display the name of the operator, product and emergency contact number.

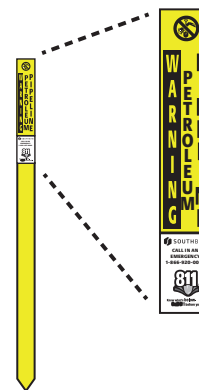
### Marker signs

### Marker "slat" post



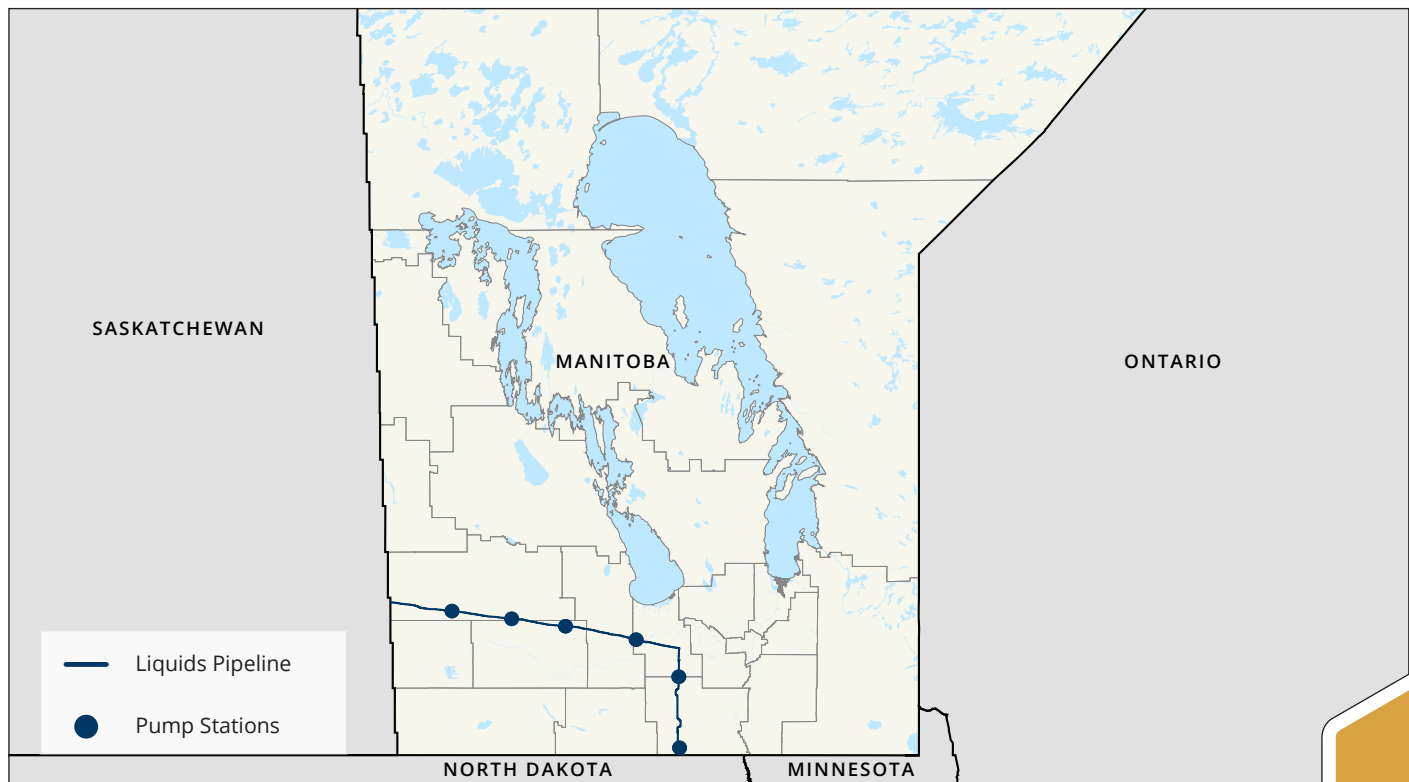
### How can I recognize a pipeline right-of-way?

A ROW is usually identifiable as a cleared strip of land without structures or trees, with pipeline markers located at road crossings, waterways and other key locations.

It contains the pipeline and a buffer area 30 metres wide that extends on either side of the pipeline. Certain activities are restricted in this area to ensure that the pipeline can operate safely.

### Did you know?

You can place an emergency locate request in the case of an emergency, natural disaster, or other urgent need where you are unable to give the appropriate advanced notice to your One-Call Centre. Simply visit [ClickBeforeYouDig.com](http://ClickBeforeYouDig.com) to find your provincial One-Call service, or contact them directly and submit an emergency locate request.

### In the case of an emergency:

1. Stop all excavation and construction. Shut off all machinery if safe to do so and move upwind from the area on foot – warn others to do the same.
2. Do not attempt to repair the pipe or operate any valves.
3. Call **'911'** as soon as you are in a safe location. Describe the situation and inform the operator of any injuries, leaking product or fire.
4. Call South Bow's emergency number at **1-866-920-0007**. Warn others to stay away from the area.
